QUESTION: What is the meaning of your visit to Tara today?-----

I am optimistic and confident that we will have a universal and ambitious agreement. I am urging member states to look beyond their national boundaries. Climate change does not respect national boundaries. It impacts all throughout the world and, therefore, we have to have a global vision, global solidarity. The sea level is rising. Global temperatures are warming. This year, 2015, is the warmest year in human history. Therefore, there is not time to lose. We need to take action now. The time for action is now "1./
